Memorandum of Agreement—Extension—Effective July 1, 2022 Through June 30, 2023

This Memorandum of Agreement (hereinafter "Agreement") is entered into by and between the Governor of Maryland, the Maryland State Department of Education (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "State"), and the Service Employees International Union, Local 500, CtW (hereinafter referred to as the "Union").


In accordance with § 9.5-704 of the Education Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, the State and the Union have met and negotiated on matters of concern to the parties pertaining to family child care providers covered by the above-referenced law.

The State and the Union agree to the current terms of the Memorandum of Agreement dated July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2021, which was extended from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, and agree to further extend the Memorandum of Agreement for one year covering the period July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023.

In as much as the parties are negotiating in good faith to complete and sign a new Memorandum of Agreement as soon as possible, this extension is for the sole purpose of accomplishing that goal. All terms, conditions, and obligations of both parties shall remain in






